KEWAUNEE-American Legion Post 29, VFW Post 3392, and Kewaunee County War Memorial

On Memorial Day, May 26, 2014, veterans will assemble at the American Legion Post 29 building at the intersection of Lincoln and Juneau Streets at 9:30 a.m. and proceed to the Kewaunee Care Center for a Memorial Service at 9:45 a.m. The veterans will then proceed to the Kewaunee High School to assemble for the parade that will begin at 10:15 a.m. at the Kewaunee High School. The parade will proceed north on Third Street to Riverview Cemetery for a firing off of Miller Street in memory of, and to honor, all deceased veterans buried in that cemetery. The parade will then proceed east on Miller Street, south on Second Street, and east on Vliet Street to the Holy Rosary Church Cemetery where a firing will be held in the center of the cemetery. The parade will then proceed to the Kewaunee County Courthouse for a short program.

The program will begin at 11:00 a.m. with an invocation followed by the National Anthem. The Kewaunee High School band will be performing musical selections and a student from Kewaunee High School will give a patriotic speech. There will be a placement of Roll honoring all veterans buried in Kewaunee's Riverview and Holy Rosary Cemeteries and a reading of the Rolls of Honor recognizing all Kewaunee veterans and Kewaunee County veterans buried in the Kewaunee County cemeteries who have passed away since Memorial Day 2013. Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 3392 will place a wreath honoring all Kewaunee County servicemen who gave their lives in war. Taps will then be played. The Master of Ceremonies will be Joe Aulik, Kewaunee County Veterans Service Officer. All those who served in the military, members of civic organizations and Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts are again invited to participate in the parade. Automobiles will be provided for those veterans who wish to ride in the parade. In the event of inclement weather, the program will be held at the Kewaunee High School gymnasium at 11:15 a.m. immediately following the ceremony on the Courthouse grounds, the public is invited by the American Legion for refreshments and lunch at the Kewaunee Legion Building at the intersection of Lincoln and Juneau Streets.

MEMORIAL DAY OBSERVANCE AND FLAG ETIQUETTE



Memorial Day is upon us and it is time to remember our nation's veterans who have provided the freedom we enjoy today. It is much more than a three-day weekend that marks the beginning of summer. Dating back to the Civil War, it is a time we set aside to honor the nation's deceased veterans by decorating their graves and honoring them at memorial programs remembering the sacrifices that were made for us.

I encourage everyone to take time to participate in one of the many memorial programs that will be taking place in each community.

Along with Memorial day comes the beginning of parade season and we need to brush up on our flag etiquette. As a reminder, when the flag is passing in a parade all persons present (including children) should face the flag and stand at attention with your right hand over the heart. Those present in uniform should render the military salute. When not in uniform, men should remove their headdress with right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart. This honors the flag and also honors those individuals who sacrificed so much to keep our country free.
