Kewaunee County Raising Awareness of Child Abuse and Sexual Assault

KEWAUNEE, WI – The Kewaunee County Department of Human Services, Violence Intervention Project (VIP) and Kewaunee County Victim Witness Program are asking the public to help raise awareness in April, which is Child Abuse Prevention Month and Sexual Assault Awareness Month.

During 2017, the Kewaunee County Department of Human Services received 133 reports of child abuse or neglect, which is dramatically up from the 79 reports received in 2016.

"It is really important that all community members be aware of child abuse and neglect and come together to protect our youth," says Bob Mattice, Kewaunee County Department of Human Services Director. "Every child deserves to grow up in a safe, stable and nurturing home."

Last year, Violence Intervention Project provided services to 69 individuals in Kewaunee County, including women, men and children, as a result of sexual assault, an increase from 49 individuals in 2016.

"If you or someone you know is experiencing sexual assault or domestic violence, you are not alone," says Laura, Violence Intervention Project Agency Advocate. "VIP services are free, confidential and accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days per week."

To show support for prevention efforts, the Kewaunee County Department of Human Services, VIP and Kewaunee County Victim Witness Program are asking the public for their participation in the upcoming events and activities, which includes a #MeToo movement. #MeToo boxes will be on display across the community until April 13th for the public to place cards with their stories or words of encouragement for survivors.
